Past/New Business

- Where are we on the purchases discussed at the last meeting
 - Everything was purchased and distributed to the agencies
 - Handled before the end of last fiscal year
- Discussion of Reversion Fund Awards
 - At the last meeting we had discussed how to use the \$28,887
 - For more Cameras for vehicles
 - Training for Law Enforcement
 - Smart Screens for the Treatment Providers
 - When proposing these expenses to the grantor, it was suggested that we maybe try something else
 - Asking for PAS Flashlights
 - Ford – Not really relevant because they cannot be used in court
 - Suggestion from the CCSO – and approved via email
 - Start an ankle monitoring program
 - Approved by the state and we are waiting for the contract documentation
- Where are we with the billboard?
 - County Manager Pyle has asked about a billboard
 - Rey has not gotten it done. It keeps getting “back burnered”. - is there a day or time that works best – Just let us know and they will make it work – couple of units and the K9 – give them dates and times and they will be there
 - Still need to get together to take the picture
 - Also Rey Learned at the last DWI Affiliate meeting that NMDOT has “ENDWI” billboards and is looking into getting one of those out in our area
 - Would also be helpful because DFA is being selective with advertising funding
 - We need to get a billboard up – Nathan McCurry, Bob Morgan or Randy
- Got the bids to get the wagon wrapped. Get some samples and send out for everyone to look at
- Clovis Municipal School District partnered with the Curry County DWI Task Force to hold a billboard design contest for students throughout the district
 - Billboard owned by the school district at the corner of Thornton and Llano Estacado
 - Vote on the artwork submitted by the kids throughout the community
 - Victim Impact Panel will purchase the sign
 - Winner named Daniel Olivias, Yucca Middle School
 - Will present a certificate and \$200 VISA gift card at the school with the parents
- Community Outreach and Participation
 - Brainstorm how to get more people to come to our meetings
 - Would like to get commitment from the DA’s office and a Judge
 - Joseph Strickland, Deputy School Superintendent, good person to have on board, see if he would assign a person, that would be good
 - Time and length of meeting okay? Yes it still works we keep it short
- Bowman – can we purchase or replace the camera
 - More than 3 years old
 - Might be cheaper to purchase than repair

Motion to allow the use of VIP funds to repair or purchase camera for Texico Police Department, up to \$6000.00. Motion: Doug Ford. Second: Brain Forde. All in favor. None opposed.

- Rich – Would like to purchase one more radio for the mounted patrol and the earpiece portion for each radio

Motion to allow the use of VIP funds to purchase one additional radio and eight microphones for the Curry County Mounted Patrol, up to \$1200.00. Motion: Doug Bowman. Second: Matt Broom. All in favor. None opposed.

- Roper – Possible PAS Flashlight and breath tubes for the breathalyzer – agreed compliance can have one
- Rey to confirm with CCSO that they want the PAS Flashlights
- Look into heavy duty banner to go over Main Street


Chairman’s Report


