## Past/New Business

- Doria Rey: Discussion of House Bill 35 and the possible ramifications on the DWI Program.
  - If HB35 passes, it will maintain the current level of distribution of the Liquor Excise Tax to the Local DWI Grant Fund at 45%
  - Leaves our distribution (the amount of money we receive from the state to run our DWI program) pretty close to where we are currently.
  - If this bill doesn't pass the percentage of Liquor Excise Tax distributed across the Local DWI Grant Fund will drop to 41.5%
  - Budget will more closely resemble the one we had a year ago when we had to make considerable cutbacks mid-year.
- Doria Rey: Discussion of Grant / Distribution Application for FY2019
  - Attended application workshop during NMAC Legislative Session Conference on January 18, 2018 in Santa Fe, NM
  - Grant application is due March 2, 2018
  - Due to the possible cut to distribution we will be applying for the total amount possible \$187,013

- Application to be similar to last year's 40% to prevention, 10% for enforcement, 19% for Compliance, 15% for coordination, 16% for alternative sentencing.
  - The majority of this is for salaries and operational expenses
  - Will ask for more from grant due to the cuts to distribution - \$93,786 – approximately 40% will go to treatment, 60% to compliance
  - Will there be money for cameras or banners? Probably not in this year's budget and we still cannot use grant or distribution funds for advertising – may possibly be able to utilize OSAP Funds.
- Lonnie Leslie: Review & Discussion of Potential Task Force Members
    - We should reach out to the Ministerial Alliance
    - Do PSA's advertising meetings on Rooney Moon
    - Need to recruit someone from the DA's Office – Mr. Leslie to reach out to Ben Cross
    - Need to recruit the Magistrate Judges
  - Lonnie Leslie: Discuss By-Laws
    - Please send out revised By-Laws
    - We will review and re-address.
  - Where are we with the billboard? Doria Rey: I am playing phone tag with Randy trying to get a time and date worked out.
  - Where are we with the SAFE Training? Doria Rey: I haven't contacted them yet.

#### **Public Input for Which No Action Will be Taken**



- Due to library closing earlier we will no longer be holding the VIP at the library, tried for the first time on February 13, 2018 worked out nicely.


