- Working with the schools to get more referrals to our programs
- Felonies are becoming a bigger problem among youth offenders, we only see misdemeanor
- Trying to get more youth and adult volunteers, working with Nicole Roybal to get a training together for the end of June.
- Always need more volunteers

Past/New Business

- Juvenile Adjudication Fund Grant Application – due May 23, 2018, resolution complete, typically funds the classes for teen court sanctions
 - Somewhat overlaps with JJAC grant
 - Teen Court needs more volunteers
 - Possible help with incentives such as trips and shirts
 - Peer to peer sanctioning, good program
 - Volunteers are currently being recruited from JROTC at the schools, however, would like more ideas where to get volunteers, possibly speech classes
- By-laws
 - *Motion to approve By-Laws of Curry County DWI Task Force as presented May 17, 2018. Motion: Dan Thompson. Second: Rich Jones. All in favor. None opposed.*
 - Introduce Tanya Henderson, new OSAP Community Program Manager, next meeting to be determined
- Discussion of Needs:
 - DWI Trailer looks bad, possibility of wrapping the trailer to make it look nicer.
 - Contact Clovis Signs for decals, or All Star Dents/Zbro Graphics, reasonable prices and do good work
 - Rich Jones attachments for hand-microphones and vehicle First Aid Kits, State currently gives them out. No opposition to purchase, Rey to determine fund for purchase.
 - Need adult volunteers for Teen Court, can law enforcement get paid overtime to volunteer? No, only for saturation patrols.

- Body Cams for CPD due to JAG grant funding being on hold they are unable to purchase, might be able to purchase a few more? They get broken easily. Typically, about \$450 - \$500, we can use VIP money to purchase. Ford to get information to Rey.
- Can we purchase banners? No promotional items or advertising from DWI, possibly from VIP






