- \$8,665.00 was reverted back at the end of the fiscal year, treatment was not spent down.

<i>Distribution (FY17)</i>	
Current Yr. Dist. Year To Date:	\$ 185,528.44
Current Yr. Expenditures to Date:	\$ 163,365.33
Current Expenditures this Period:	\$ 57,071.18
Distribution Balance:	\$ 22,163.11

- \$22,163.11 is the amount that was reverted – this is due to approximately \$12,000 for an unfilled position and we received and approximate extra \$10,000 with the fourth quarter distribution that we were unable to spend down.
- The DWI Grant Council Meeting is November 2, 2017 we will know by then if we will be able to reapply for the reverted funds.

Financial:

- Juvenile Adjudication Fund Grant

Billboards:

- New billboard is on 60/84
- Need to redo picture, would still like to use the "Going Out, So are We" billboard
- Randy Holland was the photographer last time we took the photo, he didn't charge the Task Force for his services
- Photo was taken on the dirt hill behind Clovis Christian Academy
- Need to get with the photographer to get a date and then make sure law enforcement can be there
- Bob Morgan to be the backup photographer if needed
- Deanna Boullion to help
- Second possible billboard location at Barry Elementary
 - Possibly something anti-drug / drinking
 - Mr. Strickland to inquire
 - We could possibly pay for the graphics

Red Ribbon Week – October 23 – 31, 2017

- In the past the DWI Task Force helped financially and with the distribution of red ribbons
- Typically this was a prevention function – they would work with all the schools in the mornings and at lunchtime to educate and pass out prizes
- Cannot use DWI Distribution funds for promotional items
- Contact Rocky Bernard at Bernard Farms to partner on an event at their location, possibly hand out promotional items

Motion to use \$1,500 from Victim Impact Panel funds to purchase promotional items for Red Ribbon Week. Motion: Dean Marney. Second: Amber McDaniel. All in favor. None opposed.

New Equipment

- Dean Marney could use small chest cameras to be used during compliance checks, cost about \$150/each.
- Both Curry County Sheriff's Office and the Clovis Police Department could use new cameras for their cars. Cameras cost about \$5,000/each.
- Curry County Mounted Patrol would like new radios for their nine patrolmen. Radios cost approximately \$750 per radio.
- New Mexico State Police and Texico Police Department do not need new cameras.

Motion to spend \$26,000 to purchase two new cameras for the Curry County Sheriff's Office, not to exceed \$10,000, two cameras for the Clovis Police Department, not to exceed \$10,000 and nine radios for the Mounted Patrol, not to exceed \$6,000; to be paid out of the reversion funds if applicable and Victim Impact Panel Fees. Motion: Cleo Baker. Second: Mike Reeves. All in favor. None opposed.

Other New Business

- Would like to spend more on enforcement training when possible, this is a good use of our money

- In the process of hiring a new Compliance Officer – would like to purchase a vest
 - Compliance Salary would come partially from fees collected and partially from DWI Distribution
 - A new vest costs approximately \$1,100

Motion to use \$1,100 from Victim Impact Panel funds to purchase a vest for the new Compliance Officer, once hired. Motion: Rich Jones. Second: Dean Marney. All in favor. None opposed.

- Possibly bring the S.A.F.E. presentation back to Curry County
 - An impactful presentation at the High School
 - Will need to discuss with Principal Brady
 - Superintendent Strickland confirmed that the school district is concerned with the whole student education
 - Premier Distributing helped to pay for the program last time. They are required to spend a certain amount of money on education. They were very good partners last time.
 - Program costs between \$5,000 - \$6,000
 - It has been approximately three years since the last time Curry County hosted this presentation
 - Texico, Portales and Cannon Air Force Base would all be interested having the presentation as well
 - Deanna Bouillon has agreed to assist






