Introductions

I. Part 1: Reports of boards, committees, departments and presentations

(No actions will be taken on any report, discussion or other informational items)

A. Office of Substance Abuse Prevention (OSAP) - Shelley Meeks

1. DEA Take Back event update was a success. They collected about 80 pounds of medications that got turned in.
2. Families Talk Community event. We are still struggling to get people from within the community to attend events. Twelve attendees were various people who support our organizations as opposed to community members. We advertised through the schools, and tried our best to get parental involvement. Explained that the event was targeting underage drinking. We received a stipend from SAMHSA through OSAP to put on the event. DWI and OSAP partnered for the event. Provided child-care and dinner, still didn't get the attendance we wanted. Reconnected with Clovis Counseling through Eric Banagay as a speaker. It is a struggle to get community members involved.
3. OSAP Sustainability. The OSAP grant is ending this fiscal year. There may be some block money to extend it out for another 6 months. Tanya identified areas where we will have gaps that will need to be addressed next fiscal year. Youth Services department, OSAP does the media broadcasting (Zia for sports packages and Rooney Moon for other.) Youth resiliency surveys are important to continue. We have good buy-in from the schools, and definitely want that to continue. We are working to find other funding.

II. Reports and statistics from personnel

- A. Teen Court – Shelley Meeks
 - Kristian Massey is our new Teen Court Coordinator.
 - 13 active cases
 - 5 pending
 - 33 completed successfully
 - 16 turned back as unsuccessful
 - 8 larceny/shoplifting
 - 9 battery/public affray
 - 3 minors in possession
 - 1 disorderly conduct
 - 1 criminal damages
 - 1 interfering with the educational process
 - No alcohol related charges during Q1.
- B. DWI Compliance
 - No representation
- C. Prevention – Shelley Meeks
 - Positive Action we physically go into 7 schools. La Casita, James Bickley, Barry, Mesa, Zia, Texico, and Grady. We purchased curriculum for CMS to use with targeted at-risk youth. Cameo is interested, but we struggle to get it coordinated with them.
- D. Red Ribbon Week was a huge success. We had participation in all the Clovis schools except one. We did door decorating contests. Three of the schools had 100% participation. We visited 10 schools at least once during the week. Lonnie Leslie confirmed that we got 4th Degree Felony Tags on bottles at the CHS concession stand. Tanya also got tags on bottles at the new Hilltop liquor store.
- E. Drug Court Stats – Rasha Lawrence
 - 10 participants in Curry County Drug Court. Would like to see it grow to 15-20. Right now, the cases are felony drug cases. DWI cases need to be DWI 2s because the minimum participation is 15 months. Would love to see more DWIs in the program.
- F. Treatment
 - 1. Matt 25 – Steve Reshetar
 - July-September Matt 25 had 4 participants. Three carried over and one new. Still not seeing many referrals.
 - 2. Mental Health Resources – No stats
 - 3. Three7 Project – No representation. Shelley reported a slight increase in Boys Council/Girls Circle, but not overly high.
- G. Enforcement
 - 1. City of Clovis Police Department – August thru November
 - 27 DWIs
 - 18 aggravated
 - 8 non-aggravated
 - 1 felony
 - DREs participated in two
 - Average BAC was 0.14
 - Four alcohol related crashes

3. New Mexico State Police – Sgt. Soule
10 DWIs
1 was a pursuit with drugs involved also
1 check point between Clovis and Portales. They utilized new equipment purchased by the DWI Task Force.
4. Texico Police Department – Chief Bowman
No DWIs to report. Pick-up in youth and marijuana. (Vape use.)
5. Cannon Air Force Base – Rich Jones
Nothing to report for Q1.
6. Special Investigations Division
Dean Marney transferred to Albuquerque.

III. Part 2: Reports of boards, committees, departments and presentations

- A. Shoplifting and MIP follow-up discussion – Shelley Meeks
Concern that we were seeing shoplifting alcohol and not being charged with MIP. JPOs stated once it got to them, they couldn't change anything. Captain Romero stated Oriana called during a busy week and they have not spoken further.
- B. Red Ribbon Week report – Shelley Meeks
Nothing further to report.
- C. Develop a plan to update voting and non-voting members – Shelley Meeks
Quorum is 4 voting members. If you are an alternative to someone and serving as a proxy, we need it in writing by the voting member. Email is fine. According to our by-laws, anyone who receives financial benefit cannot vote, and no member of Curry County can be a voting member. We can change our by-laws and member list as we see fit. We need a plan to get it fixed. Lonnie confirmed that law enforcement can vote as long as they are not a recipient of funds, either directly or indirectly. How do we want to go about updating members and the by-laws? Lonnie proposed Shelley, Rich, and he get together to look at the member list and the by-law. Send out to the membership for input, and vote by email.
- D. Recognition program for law enforcement follow-up discussion – Shelley Meeks
Shelley checked with the County Manager, and there is no problem using county funds to do a recognition program. What do we want to do with that? Shelley would like some help coming up with a program that would be beneficial to law enforcement. Lonnie suggested that the law enforcement represented submit names. High producers from a different agency each quarter. We want to recognize someone every quarter rotating through each agency if the agency felt someone had done something noteworthy. DWI Task Force will seek nominations. Shelley asked if this has turned into an action item.

Motion to approve recognizing law enforcement as discussed with a certificate and a gift card valued at \$75. Motion: Doug Bowman. Second: Rashan Lawrence. All in favor. None opposed.

- E. New business introduced. Want to do some sort of recognition for Captain Dial. Captain Romero indicated it was acceptable, and would get with the Chief to determine the best way to present that to Captain Dial. A certificate or plaque would be most appropriate. A plaque would be best.

Motion to approve a plaque to Captain Roger Dial of the Clovis PD for his lifetime achievement DWI enforcement valued at \$75. Motion: Rich Jones. Second: Steve Reshetar. All in favor. None opposed.


